

## Painting the town pink in Cinnaminson for a good cause

The Cinnaminson Fire Department Breast Cancer Awareness Committee have announced 2017's "Paint the Town Pink" campaign. This is the seventh year the department will be raising funds and awareness for breast cancer.

Last year was the department's most successful year, raising \$8,600. This year,

the goal is to raise at least \$10,000.

The funds raised will go toward Virtua's Tyanna Barre O'Brien Breast Care Comfort Fund, which helps breast cancer patients obtain items not readily available to them without financial assistance.

Also benefitting is the Rebecca A. Scott Memorial Scholarship Fund, which helps local paramedics

obtain scholarships to assist with their training. Scott was a paramedic with Virtua who often worked with local members at emergency scenes, who passed away from breast and liver cancer at age 28.

The department is asking residents and business owners in Cinnaminson to join in painting the town pink, with pink lights and bows

displayed on houses and businesses, as well as shirts and pins worn throughout October.

All of these items will be available through the department.
